In other words, the thesis directly answers the question asked by the assignment. Remember, your supports should be facts, not opinions!

- 1) I think...
- 2) I believe...
- 3) May be...
- 4) Might be...

Do not use any of these in your thesis; state your point of view AS A FACT!
